This Mass will be celebrated by Archbishop Eamon with Bishop Michael and priests from across the Archdiocese of Armagh. Holy Oils which will be used in parishes across the Archdiocese over the coming year will be blessed by Archbishop Eamon.

Easter Triduum Celebration

Holy Thursday: Mass of the Lord's Supper will be celebrated at 7.30pm in St Patrick's Cathedral

Good Friday: The Lord's Passion, 3pm St Patrick's Cathedral.

Holy Saturday: Morning prayer will be celebrated at 10am in St Patrick's Cathedral

Easter Liturgies (Saturday Evening and Sunday)

Easter Vigil: Will be celebrated at 9pm in St Patrick's Cathedral at 9pm Easter Sunday: Mass will be celebrated in St Patrick's Cathedral at 11am & 12.30pm


